

# ty pennington impressions

for your own design makeover

## Quilted Throw



Finished Size: 32" x 52"

### Materials:

\* Ty Pennington Impressions™ 54/55"-wide 100% cotton sateen fabrics:

### Fabrics shown on throw:

#### Front:

HDTY08 Spice  
HDTY01 Spice  
HDTY05 Spice  
HDTY03 Spice  
HDTY04 Persimmon  
HDTY13 Spice  
HDTY03 Espresso

#### Floral Appliqué:

HDTY07 Charcoal

#### Back:

HDTY05 Spice

\* Low-loft batting

\* 1 1/2 yards of pattern tracing paper

\* Sewing machine

\* Coats & Clark Dual Duty XP® all-purpose sewing thread to match

\* General sewing supplies

### Cut from Ty Pennington Impressions™ fabrics:

- Seven coordinating fabric strips ranging from 5" x 54/55" to 11" x 54/55", to equal 38" x 54/55" for throw piecing
- 1/2 yard of fabric for accent strips
- 1/4 yard of HDTY07 Charcoal Blossom
- 1 1/2 yards of coordinating fabric for throw back

### Basic Instructions:

*Note: Use a 1/2" seam allowance and sew seams with right sides together unless otherwise indicated.*

1. To plan the throw front, draw a 33" x 53" rectangle on the pattern tracing cloth. Refer to the photo and draw angled lines for the seven piecing strips. Cut the pieces out. Use each piece as a pattern to cut the shape from fabric, adding 1/2" seam allowances to the long edges.

2. With right sides together, use a 1/2" seam allowance and sew the strips together as planned. Press seams open.

3. To add the accent strips, cut six 2 1/4"-wide strips across the width of the fabric. Press the long edges under 1/4". Center a strip over each piecing seam and edgestitch in place.

4. Cut six motifs from the Blossom fabric, adding 1/4" seam allowances. Cut six matching circles for the backs. Sew the motifs and backs together with right sides facing, using a 1/4" seam allowance. Cut a slit in the center of each back and turn the circle right side out. Press the edges. Randomly position on the throw front and edgestitch in place.

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5. Trim the edge of the pieced front evenly, if needed, making sure the corners are square. Cut the back fabric and batting to match the front. Layer the backing right side up, the front right side down, and the batting on top, with edges even and pin. Sew the layers together, leaving an opening for turning. Trim the seam allowances and corners. Turn the throw right side out and slipstitch the opening closed.

6. Topstitch around the throw, 1 1/2" from the edges. Quilt the throw by stitching along the edge of each accent strip.
